

Acacia Network by the Numbers! Our Work in Brooklyn

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Acacia Network and its affiliates have continued to provide uninterrupted integrated care to vulnerable communities across New York City and beyond. Our footprint in Brooklyn consists of permanent affordable housing, homeless shelters for single adults and families, social services, mental health and addiction services, and supportive housing for individuals with mental health and/or addiction disorders.



3,000+ individuals & families housed through our affordable & supportive housing developments.



<u>216,000 pounds</u> of food distributed through our food pantry, equivalent to 14,400 helpings of food.



Over 550 seniors, adults, and families served through our homeless shelters in Brooklyn



More than 1,000 individuals provided outpatient and residential mental health and addiction services.



Our Mobile Medical Unit has conducted hundreds of free COVID-19 tests, in addition to providing outreach and services through our Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Team to address substance use in the neighborhood, including distribution of Narcan kits and PPE.

Affordable Housing

Our affordable housing portfolio in Brooklyn includes 1,321 units serving approximately 3,000 individuals and families in Palmetto Gardens, Bushwick II and Hope Gardens that are being rehabilitated as part of the NextGeneration NYCHA plan, and provide long-term housing through the Rental Assistance Demonstration ("RAD") and Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) programs.

Acacia Network has provided <u>additional supports and services</u> to tenants of these building to ensure their health and wellbeing throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on tenant wellness and stability, referrals to services, assistance with public benefits applications, COVID-19 testing, and prevention.

Supportive Housing

Our supportive housing portfolio in Brooklyn includes 14 scatter-site apartments that serve 21 tenants with severe mental disabilities, substance use disorders, and/or a persistent history of homelessness, including:

- Six (6) units through the Basics PMP/ Black Vets scatter site supportive housing program, serving single adults who have a serious and persistent mental illness;
- Eight (8) units through the Promesa Continuum of Care (Shelter + Care), serving individuals who are chronically homeless or homeless with a chronic substance use disorder.

Homeless Shelters



Acacia Network's transitional housing portfolio in Brooklyn includes <u>eight (8) commercial hotel sites</u> converted to homeless shelters, including:

- Four (4) buildings that serve <u>183 families with</u> <u>children</u>;
- Three (3) buildings that serve 333 single seniors;
- One site that has been vacated due to COVID-19, which has the capacity to serve **50 single adult men**.

Behavioral Care

Our behavioral health and addiction services in Brooklyn include outpatient treatment programs (OTP), chemical dependency outpatient programs (CDOP), and residential programs, serving a total of **1,065** individuals:

- Outpatient treatment programs (OTP): 850 individuals
- Chemical Dependency Outpatient Program (CDOP): 125 individuals
- Residential Programs: 90 individuals
