Our Work in Manhattan

Acacia Network and our affiliates have a rich and longstanding history in the Borough of Manhattan, with our roots stretching from the Lower East Side (“Loisaida”) to East Harlem / “El Barrio”, all the way up to “The Heights” in Upper Manhattan. Our Manhattan-based services and programs include: affordable, supportive, and transitional housing; education & youth development; workforce development & training; mental health & addiction treatment; cultural programming, and more.



1,400+ units of affordable and supportive housing serving primarily low-income and/or formerly homeless households



900+ individuals of all ages served through our integrated outpatient behavioral health services and residential programs



1,000+ patients served by our clinics in the Bronx hail from Manhattan, primarily from East Harlem and Washington Heights



25,000+ individuals reached annually through arts & culture programming spearheaded by our affiliate, The Loisaida Center

Affordable & Supportive Housing



Affordable Housing Portfolio: Includes our **179-unit** development Acacia Gardens in East Harlem; **33 buildings with 420 units** managed through our newest affiliate, El Barrio's Operation Fightback (EBOF), and Sendero Verde, a mixed-use development in joint venture with Jonathan Rose Companies and L+M Development Partners that will encompass **over 700 units**, among others.

Supportive Housing Portfolio: Includes three (3) Individual Residential Alternative (IRA) programs licensed through the NYS Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) in East Harlem and four (4) scatter site supportive housing units in West Harlem.

Mental Health & Addiction Services



ACDP Outpatient Mental Health Clinic: We provide integrated mental health and substance use services, including M.A.T. and 24/7 crisis response, to 700+ individuals of all ages through a CCBHC expansion grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

Greenhope Services for Women: Is a residential program for adult women (with or without children) seeking treatment for a substance use disorder, fully licensed by the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS), which served 200+ patients in 2021.

Education & Youth Development



Through our education, afterschool, and youth development affiliate, the Community Association of Progressive Dominicans (ACDP), we serve hundreds of school-age students and their families through our COMPASS Programs, Community School, and Learning Lab.

Arts & Culture



Our arts & culture affiliate, **The Loisaida Center**, provides free and low-cost arts programming, youth development initiatives, senior & family services, as well as neighborhood revitalization and community development activities.

Loisaida serves approximately 2,000 individuals of all ages annually through year-round, in-house and virtual programming, and an additional 25,000+ through our Annual Loisaida Festival. Our cultural programming
